This image of screen star Grace Kelly is taken from the film *To Catch a Thief* and portrays perfectly why she was regarded as one of the most beautiful women in the world. Her look was elegant, every inch royalty even before marrying Prince Rainier of Monaco in 1956. Kelly's career was prolific but short. She made her first film, *Fourteen Hours*, in 1951 and her last, *High Society*, in 1958, making her the true 1950s icon. Her look in this image (opposite) is perfect for a wedding day – we've chosen a cream net and silk satin strapless dress as a modern equivalent and teamed it with diamanté earrings and a large crystal drop necklace. The final detail is silver leather sandals.
